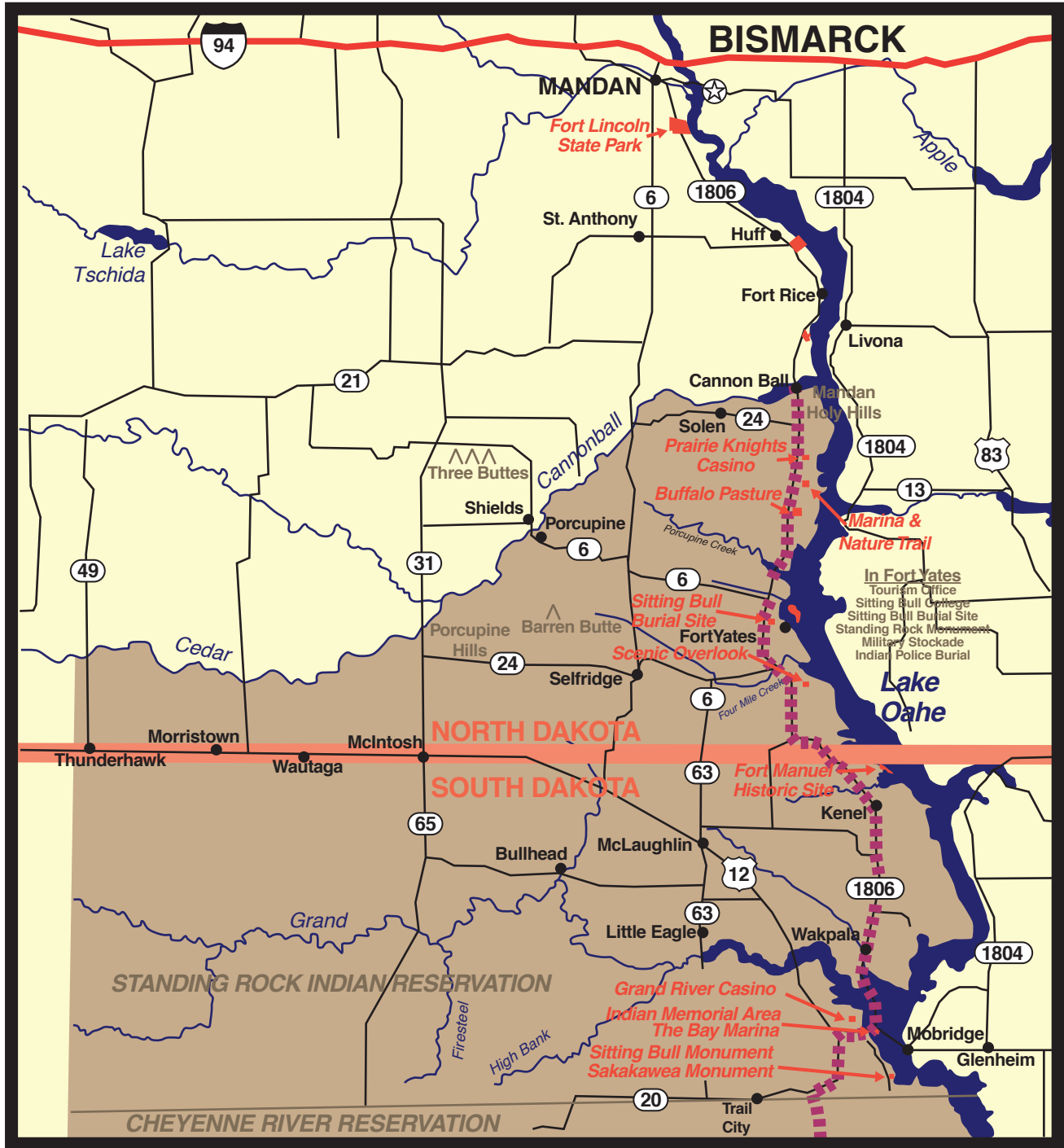




STANDING ROCK

The Standing Rock National Native American Scenic Byway extends 86 miles, all of which lies within the boundaries of the Standing Rock Sioux Indian Reservation. The Byway is rich with Native American culture, historic sites including a fur trading fort, and natural, recreational, and scenic qualities without equal.

Driving the Byway - North to South

Begin by crossing the Cannonball River on Highway 1806 in North Dakota and entering the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation. Continue straight along Highway 1806 for 29.1 miles. The road will change from Highway 1806 to Highway 24. Turn left onto Highway 1806 and continue for another 14 miles to the South Dakota border.

At the South Dakota border, turn left and continue along Highway 1806 for 31 miles. Turn right onto US Highway 12, and continue 60 miles to the junction of Highway 20.
